

29th March: 1932.

A meeting of Committee was held on the above date, Mr Ley presiding.

Minutes of previous meeting read and adopted.

Secretary reported that he had received a further communication from the Revenue Authorities to the effect that the Institute was not exempt from the Land Tax of 15d. Secretary instructed to deal with this.

With regard to the Point-to-Point dance on Thursday April 7th, the usual arrangements re refreshments, Adverts, doorkeepers, etc were made — Lemonade to be ordered from Mr Sketch.

Agreed for Mr. J. Jones (G) to purchase parts of broken forms for 1/6.

Decided to get suitable lamps or Lamps for warming Billiard Table, and Mr Parsell to be instructed to make three metal shades for existing lamps over table.

A special meeting was also held on  
6<sup>th</sup> April after most of the members of  
Committee had been assisting in getting  
building ready for Dance, when an application  
by Mr Coosmore for use of Institute on  
Thursday May 5<sup>th</sup> for a qualifying Whist Drive  
and Dance in connection with Hospital was  
considered. Granted at inclusive fee of  
one guinea, subject to the usual regulation  
re closing at midnight.

A further extra-ordinary meeting was  
held on the evening (28<sup>th</sup> April) members of the  
Committee were engaged putting in posts round  
the building, when Secretary reported that a  
number of the younger members of the Institute  
had approached him with a view to getting the  
Committee to 'back up' their efforts to run a  
football team during the coming winter. Decided  
that a members meeting be convened to follow  
the annual meeting of Committee and that the  
young members in the meantime be asked to  
prepare suggestions, etc.

Messrs D. Adams and B. Jenkins were  
elected auditors. — R. Stancombe
