A meeting of Committee was held on the above date: present: messrs S.C. Ley (presiding) W. Adams, R. Adams, B. Jenkins, J.G. Jones, J. Jones, S. James, E. Lousmore, & W.S. Root.

Minutes of previous meeting read and adopted.

M. Lousmore, on behalf of Pope Hill Baptist Church, made the following applications:

- (a) Loan of chairs for services to be held in Johnston Cl. School on 22nd-29th. Oct. — Granted free.
- (b) Hire of Institute for concert on Thursday Nov. 30th. Granted at charge of 10/-.

With regard to Hlangwm District Billiard League, the chairman reported the correspondence he had received. As only one team from this village would be entering this year it had been decided that Institute enter. — the first match to be played in the coming week.

Discussion then ensued with regard to the membership subscription of members of the Football Club. Many of these members very rarely

frequent me Institute and they felt that a total fee of 4/- (2/6 ordinary membership plus 1/6) was excessive. It was eventually decided that these members pay a total fee of 2/6, one shilling of which would be credited to Football funds. In addition, footballers were to be informed that they were to arrange among themselves the cleaning of ante-room. Mr. Wilfred Hurries, the secretary of the A.F.C. was called in before the Committee, and the foregoing was communicated to him.

Decided that, now the membership question had been settled, the "twopence a night" rule be rigidly enforced.
